

Culture Box Instructions

Objective

The Culture Box is a creative way for students to present their country's culture to other teams during the CONNECT meeting in Lippstadt.

What is a Culture Box?

A box filled with objects, media, and stories that represent the students' home country. Think of clothing, music, souvenirs, games, or digital elements.

What should students do?

1. Collect materials that represent their country.
2. Choose an artefact to present (e.g., dance, game).
3. Prepare a short presentation (max. 5 minutes).
4. Work together as a team on one Culture Box.
5. Bring the box to Lippstadt.

Checklist

- At least 3 objects
- One interactive element
- Short presentation
- Everything in one box or folder
- Team name and country visible

Student Section

What will you do?

Together with your group, you will make a Culture Box. This is a box with items that tell something about your country.

What can be in it?

- Clothing
- Music
- A souvenir
- A dance or game
- A video or audio clip

Gallery Walk

You will walk through the Culture Boxes in international groups (one student from each country). In your group, each student explains their own Culture Box once. This means you tell your story one time, and for the other boxes you listen to your group members.

Tip

Think about the most important things you want others to remember about your Culture Box. Choose 2–3 key points and practice explaining them clearly, so you can confidently share your story once with your international group.
